

For the SHS levels, the participants capture places and photograph them in an unusual way bringing them to the eyes of the people. The winner for Travel Photography is Niña Burce from (ABM-C) which catches the attention of the viewers in the scenic view dimension of the place in the environment.

In the second activity, the participants were challenged in Food Styling and Capture the best angle that shows the enticingness and invitingness of the common Filipino breakfast dish. Carl Sebastian Erroles (STEM C) won the said contest.

For the last activity in the SHS Department, the Grade 12 - Home Economics class presented a TikTok Bartending Skills with a twist of dancing while flaring the bottle up in the air. One of the presenters is Kimber D. Torlao, Marie Martin, and many more which can be watched through the Facebook page of Hospitality Management.

At the same time, in the College Department, one of the activities of the Hospitality Management Society is the Napkin Folding Competition. In which the team presents different food from different countries including the group creativity through cooking, plating, and video vlog editing.

And for the fourth activity, is the Let's Renew Eat Competition where the participants are the HM consisting of three group members and tasked the team to transform their leftover food into new delicious fancy dishes. And the leading group that wins this competition is Team Polaroid (Darwin Enriquez, Arian Kem Endiera, and Rodel Camo) which showcases the group's skills in creativity, food styling, and inventing new food from leftover food.

Voting is an important responsibility that all citizens of the country shall fulfill. Every voter should be aware of the qualifications of a good candidate for a government position. On February 24, 2022 La Consolacion College – Caloocan held the Voter's Empowerment Talk with We the Youth Vote guest speakers, Ms. Ria Atayde and Ms. Melia Hajiban. May 2022 elections are fast approaching, and a lot, if not the majority of the LCCC college student body, are first-time voters. Hence, LCC – Caloocan, in partnership with the Student Advisory Board, The Luminary, and We the Youth Vote, brought the Voter's Empowerment Talk.

The program started with today's generation's desire for change and how they can be the change they aspire to. Ms. Hajiban went on to explain what are the positions that we will need to vote for in the upcoming elections as well as the terms that each position will hold; she also explained the rules and conditions for the substitution of a candidate, as well as the election, campaign and voting period, together with the prohibitions that are being applied during these periods. She gave a detailed guide on what to do before, during, and after the elections and the crucial things that needed to be prepared.

As the talk carried on, the guest speakers shared their personal opinions that they would be considered in choosing their presidential candidates. They also shared their opinion on being apolitical, such as people should be aware of their environment and everything that happens around them, as the choices that everyone will make can affect the lives of all the citizens in the country. The talk concludes with Ms. Hajiban and Ms. Atayde answering questions from the students and faculty members related to the elections and the awarding of certificates for our guest speakers.





Since disinformation in social media is rampant, it is also our responsibility to correct them to ensure that information that people share is always based on facts, data, and empirical evidence. Thus, we should only believe based on our assessment of what is the truth and help minimize the possibility of confusion by false information.

General awareness of fake news is needed and people should not be silenced for taking a stand toward the truth. Everybody should be educated about the negative effects of fake news and learn to exert time and effort to fact-check the information that we encounter on the internet.





NOW HIRING: NEXT COMPETENT LEADERS OF THE PHILIPPINES!

n every election, getting to know a candidate's track record and platform is the most crucial action to be an informed and responsible voter. For, this initiative could make them realize that these people running for the position are worthy of the people's votes.

Each candidate in any position will court and do anything to fully persuade the people to vote for them on May 9th. Some focus on the entertainment factor and making fun of themselves. In contrast, others showcase their platform as well as their clean track records to persuade the people they will serve in the coming years.

Rallies, sorties, and campaigns organized by the candidates' supporters and volunteers are just some of the few ways to make them visible to the public. Nowadays, the presence of the candidates in the Election Debates and Fora organized by various News and Public Affairs Networks and the Commission on Election (COMELEC) has been the hot issue of this year's election. Is it essential for a candidate to attend those debates and fora? What does the absence or presence of the candidates in these events imply to the Filipino people?

Debates, public fora, and engagement are a great way to showcase the candidates' capability, wit, and, most important platforms to the public. These events are meant to criticize, challenge, determine the clear

stand on pressing societal issues and make a background check on candidates' moral compass, integrity, work, competence, and merit. These debunk the misconceptions of other candidates and supporters that debates are merely shows waiting for candidates to duel and fight.

There is no specific provision or electoral laws that provides punishment to those candidates who do not want to attend these engagements; it is their decision or prerogative to attend what, where, and when. Attendance and participation in debates are an overview of their leadership if ever elected. It speaks of the importance of being ready to face the Filipino people, the willingness to commit, and show up in times of crisis. Perhaps, a candidate's absence is due to prior commitment or any personal reasons. However, the lack of participation in these public engagements has become too politicized. To put it simply, election debates are political in themselves; it has become a political strategy to avoid questioning, hide the truth, and be in the limelight. It sounds cliché, as candidates running for office are eager to make themselves visible to the public. Yet, other candidates do not consider attending these events for some reason.



Debates are not futile; this allows Filipino people to know more about the candidates' character, platforms, plans, track records and competence. These can help them analyze and evaluate the candidate they want to elect. Attending these programs reflects the commitment to public service, accountability to their action, handling criticisms, the most challenging answering and controversial questions, and leadership that will appear in difficult instances. It says a lot about the candidates' commitment and leadership. It is a commendable act to face the people they will serve for the next six years. Debates and forums are similar to job interviews-Filipino people are the human resource officer, while candidates are the applicants applying for the position. Come to think of it, "Would you consider somebody who did not show up at the job interview?" the answer is yours.

The result of the election will determine if the candidates are hired for the job. It is crucial that before coming up with a decision, the next leader must be competent, worthy, has integrity, is honest, compassionate, transparent, and ready to alleviate the life of Filipino people with dignity.
